PLANTS

Germination

Plants are living things that grow from a seed. When a seed is sown in the moist soil, it begins to grow. This process is called germination. The four friends of the plant: sunlight, air, soil, and water help the plant to grow.

Different types of plants

Plants have different shapes, sizes and colours.

Weed - A weed is a plant that grows where it is not wanted. It is an unwanted plant. It can be found just anywhere.

Herbs – Plants that have a thin, soft green stem and small leaves are called herbs. Some of them have a medicinal value and some are used for cooking. E.g. Tulsi plant, Coriander plant & Mint plant.

Shrubs – Plants that have brown stems, many branches and are short in height are called shrubs. E.g. Rose plant & Hibiscus plant.

Creepers – Plants which grow along the surface of the soil and spread over a distance are called creepers e.g. Pumpkin & Watermelon.

Climbers – Plants with weak stems that need support to grow are called climbers. e.g. Grapevine & Money plant.

Trees – Tall, big and strong plants with thick brown stems are called trees. E.g. Mango tree & Coconut tree.

Edible Parts of plants

Plants are the main source of our food.

Fruits and vegetables are the edible parts of the plant.

We eat fruits like mango, apple, banana, watermelon etc.

We eat vegetables like Ladyfinger, brinjal, bottle gourd etc.

We eat roots of some plant for eg: beetroot, radish, carrot.

We eat stems of some plant for eg: ginger, potato.

We eat leaves of some plant for eg: coriander, mint leaves, spinach.

We eat flowers of some plant for eg: cauliflower, broccoli.

We eat seeds of some plant for eg: wheat, rice, pulses

Vegetables like tomato, cucumber, carrot, lettuce etc. can be eaten raw in the form of salads.

Some vegetables need to be cooked like lady finger, pumpkin, potato etc.

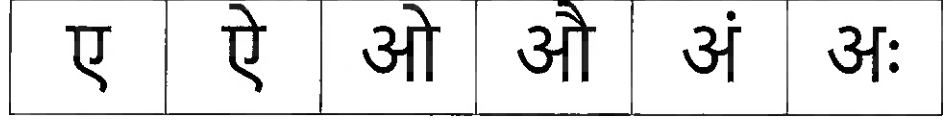
